

## **ACADEMICALLY TALENTED YOUTH PROGRAM (ATYP)**

The ATYP program at Western Michigan University has announced the addition of three high school Advanced Placement (AP) classes that are available to all students. By offering coursework for high ability learners that challenge them and help to broaden their horizons, ATYP strives to complement what local school districts offer.

Following are the programs being offered for the 2008-2009 school year:

AP Computer Science at the advanced AB level. Upon completion of this course, students will take the AP Computer Science AB test in May. Successful passing of this test will usually grant students two semesters of computer science credit at a college or university.

AP Calculus at the advance BC level. Students will take the AP Calculus BC test in May. Successful completion of this test will usually grant students two semesters of Calculus credit at a college or university.

AP World History and students will be required to take the AP World History test in May.

The deadline for registration is APRIL 17, 2008.

As the ATYP model usually serves both middle school and high school students, it is expected that those two groups of students will be mixed in these classes. For more information, contact Dr. Kelly Schultz at 387-3230.
